#### Lord, make me know your ways.

Jesus had little time for the Scribes, Pharisees, Chief Priests and Elders of the people who refused to accept the Good News which Jesus was proclaiming to his people. He condemned them as hypocrites and 'whitened sepulchres' – full of righteousness on the outside but inwardly full of corruption and sinfulness.

Earlier in Chapter 28 of St Matthew's gospel, they had challenged the authority of Jesus,

but his response had left them dumbfounded and now he expresses his frustration with them by issuing his own direct challenge, inviting them to give their opinion on the Parable of the Two Sons.

When the Father, the owner of the vineyard, asks his two sons to labour for him, they give two very different responses.

The first son tells his Father that he is not willing to labour in the vineyard but clearly his heart is heavy and his conscience is troubled. Afterwards, he reflects on his decision, on his rejection of the Father; he recognises the hurt he has caused, acknowledges his mistake and turns back and is re-united to his Father where he rejoices in his tender mercy and forgiveness.

The second son gives what appears to be the perfect answer and faithfully promises to obey but his response is empty and shallow. He says one thing but fails to act upon it – his obedience is only mere show, it has no substance. He lacks integrity – in the same way as those who were challenging the authority of Jesus.

How often do we say the right thing, just as we have been taught by our family, our school and our parish community and yet we know, deep within our hearts, that our words are sometimes shallow and superficial?

How often do we lack the heart-felt commitment to transform our spoken word, our outward expressions of faith, into a passionate love of Christ and a life of integrity devoted to the love and service of others – with a preferential care of the poor?

So, let's be honest with ourselves and with God, let's recognise our failings and turn back to the Father. He will be quick to forgive, will fill us his grace and mercy and accompany us as we seek to transform our personal lives and the life of our Parishes and Partnerships.

Lord, make me know your ways, Lord, teach me your paths. Make me walk in your truth, and teach me: for you are God my saviour.

### First Reading: The Justice of God Ezekiel 18:25-28

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows: 'You object, "What the Lord does is unjust." Listen, you House of Israel: is what I do unjust? Is it not what you do that is unjust? When the upright man renounces his integrity to commit sin and dies because of this, he dies because of the evil that he himself has committed. When the sinner renounces sin to become law-abiding and honest, he deserves to live. He has chosen to renounce all his previous sins; he shall certainly live; he shall not die.'

Response to the Psalm: Remember your mercy, Lord.

# Second Reading: God Emptied Himself in Christ Philippians 2:1-11

If our life in Christ means anything to you, if love can persuade at all, or the Spirit that we have in common, or any tenderness and sympathy, then be united in your convictions and united in your love, with a common purpose and a common mind. That is the one thing which would make me completely happy. There must be no competition among you, no conceit; but everybody is to be self-effacing. Always consider the other person to be better than yourself, so that nobody thinks of his own interests first but everybody thinks of other people's interests instead. In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus: His state was divine, yet he did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume

the condition of a slave, and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him. Alleluia!

## The Gospel: Doing the Will of the Father Matthew 21:28-32

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He went and said to the first, "My boy, you go and work in the vineyard today." He answered, "I will not go," but afterwards thought better of it and went. The man then went and said the same thing to the second who answered, "Certainly, sir," but did not go. Which of the two did the father's will?' 'The first' they said. Jesus said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him.'

#### Doing the Will of the Father

Matthew loves to tell parables of Jesus which contrast 'goodies' and 'baddies' like these two contrasting sons. Matthew's parables put everything in black-and-white terms with no shades of grey (wise and foolish wedding-attendants, sheep and goats, etc.). Luke uses a different kind of parable, in which the characters - just like ourselves - often do the right thing for the wrong reason. The sayings of Jesus were handed down by word of mouth for some years before being written down. Did the straightforward contrast in Matthew (it is odd that both change their minds without a reason) develop into Luke's parable of the Prodigal Son? Both times the 'goodie' son ends up bad, and the 'baddie' son ends up good, but in Luke's version both changes of mind are motivated, and there is great emphasis on the son's repentance and the father's overwhelming joy at getting him back. The lesson in Matthew's story is given also by Jesus' word in the Sermon on the Mount, 'It is not anyone who says to me, "Lord, Lord" who will enter the kingdom of Heaven, but the person who does the will of my Father in Heaven'. It is no use simply saying that Christ is our 'Lord'; we have to express it in our behaviour. What meaning do you find in this parable for yourself and the relationship you have with the Father?
