A Man Who Left His Mark

In speaking of the readings at Mass the Second Vatican Council recalls that: 'within the cycle of a year, [The Church] unfolds the whole mystery of Christ, from the incarnation and birth until the ascension, the day of Pentecost, and the expectation of blessed hope and of the coming of the Lord. Recalling thus the mysteries of redemption, the Church opens to the faithful the riches of her Lord's powers and merits, so that these are in some way made present for all time, and the faithful are enabled to lay hold upon them and become filled with saving grace.' (Sacrosanctum Concilium §102)

Each year in this unfolding of Our Lord's life, the Church guides us by way of a different Gospel, in Year A – St Matthew, in Year B – St Mark; and in Year C – St Luke; with the Gospel of St John filling in throughout the whole cycle, notably in Lent and in Easter. As we draw nearer to the end of the Church's year with the Solemnity of Christ the King our time with St Matthew is drawing to a close and we will move into the Gospel of St Mark.

The shortest of the Gospels, St Mark – we are told by tradition – was written not by an Apostle of the Lord, but on behalf of one – his Gospel being the distilled teaching of St Peter to the Church in Rome likely recorded by John Mark a companion of St Peter, St Paul and St Barnabas (see Acts 12:12 and 13:13). When we look at the contents of the Gospel we see much that would give credence to this ancient tradition; for the Gospel of Mark is categorized by a pace and urgency that would have spoken powerfully to the persecuted Church of Rome in the first century. It's call for conversion and the healing presence of the Lord a great comfort to a Church reeling from the attacks of the Emperor Nero.

Reading through the Gospel we find that almost everything that occurs happens 'immediately', the account of Our Lord's life is found between an almost breathless series of 'ands'. Mark 1:14 – 1:39 presents what we might consider 'A Day in the Life of Jesus', over these few verses the word 'and' appears 52 times and immediately 6 times. Reading through this short passage one cannot help but be struck by the sheer excitement of the Evangelist to communicate the life and teachings of Jesus – and that excitement is what in Year B we are called to enter into, to pick up. For we, like the Evangelist, are called to leave our mark upon the world by sharing with it the invitation to enter into the life of Jesus. I encourage you, set aside some time over the next few weeks to take up and read the Gospel as a whole, in a single sitting if you can, allow yourself to be swept up in the immediacy of the narrative. In 16 chapters we are plunged into the life of The Lord, surely there is no better way than this to prepare for Advent?

First Reading: A Woman about the House Proverbs 31:10-13.19-20.30-31

A perfect wife - who can find her? She is far beyond the price of pearls. Her husband's heart has confidence in her; from her he will derive no little profit. Advantage and not hurt she brings him all the days of her life. She is always busy with wool and with flax; she does her work with eager hands. She sets her hands to the distaff; her fingers grasp the spindle. She holds out her hand to the poor; she opens her arms to the needy. Charm is deceitful, and beauty empty; the woman who is wise is the one to praise. Give her a share in what her hands have worked for, and let her works tell her praises at the city gates.

The Response to the Psalm: O blessed are those who fear the Lord.

Second Reading: A Thief in the Night

1 Thessalonians 5:1-6

You will not be expecting us to write anything to you, brothers, about 'times and seasons', since you know very well that the Day of the Lord is going to come like a thief in the night. It is when people are saying, 'How quiet and peaceful it is,' that the worst suddenly happens, as suddenly as labour pains come on a pregnant woman;

and there will be no way for anybody to evade it. But it is not as if you live in the dark, my brothers, for that Day to overtake you like a thief. No, you are all sons of light and sons of the day: we do not belong to the night or to darkness, so we should not go on sleeping, as everyone else does, but stay wide awake and sober.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Even if you have to die, says the Lord, keep faithful, and I will give you the crown of life. Alleluia!

The Gospel: A Story about Talents

Matthew 25:14-15.19-21

Jesus spoke this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a man on his way abroad who summoned his servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents, to another two, to a third one; each in proportion to his ability. Then he set out. Now a long time after, the master of those servants came back and went through his accounts with them. The man who had received the five talents came forward bringing five more. "Sir," he said, "you entrusted me with five talents; here are five more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things; I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness.""

A Story about Talents

It is encouraging to think of all the talents which friends and neighbours have and which I don't have. It is all part of the gifts of the Spirit, which Paul sees as making up the whole Body of Christ. Everyone has a special contribution to make. As for me, it is extraordinary that God created me with all my twists, defects, fears and failures and it is precisely because of those boils, sores, abscesses that God loves me, helps me and guides me to work out my salvation. And it is just possible that there may be friends who can think that God has given me talents which make a tiny contribution to the happiness and goodness of the world. In the longer version of this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus mentions a man with just one talent who hides it in the ground: the master calls him "wicked and lazy" and has him thrown out. Why is he so severely treated? This is surely someone who resolutely turns his (or her) back on the goodness she (or he) has received and refuses to work with it for the Lord's purposes or for anyone else's. Such a talent goes to waste and merely rusts and corrupts. If I know anyone like that, it is just worth asking whether, with infinite and patient kindness. I can help that person to release their talent and bring it to blossom. Just think for a moment: what is your best talent? Is it a gift, skill or humour which brings joy and happiness to those around you? Are you like the man who buried his talent in the ground, or do you use this skill or gift or wisdom to bring joy to others?

The Refugee Project

The Refugee Project continues to welcome clients from across the world. In September, we supported 531 individuals and families and received 29 new registrations from clients in need of food and toiletries to supplement their meagre allowance. With constantly growing numbers, we really do need and appreciate your donations of food, toiletries and finance. The full list of items required is available here. With the government's announcement that they are committed to clearing the backlog of cases that have been in the asylum system for some time, we are expecting the Home Office to make decisions about some of our clients in the coming months. We are always very pleased when clients receive news that they have been granted leave to remain, but recently the government has made changes, which are adversely affecting these clients by changing the time people are given to move out of asylum accommodation once they are given refugee status - the 28-day so-called 'move on' period - with some refugees having just seven days' notice. This is leaving some of our clients homeless. The Refugee Project has added its name to a letter from several charities to the Home Secretary asking the Home Office to amend this policy and prevent eviction notices and homelessness.

Update from Justice & Peace Refugee Project

This month's update from the J&P Co-ordinating Council includes details of the next Annual General Meeting. We join with other organisations to pray for peace across the world. We pray for wherever there is conflict and look with horror on the developing crisis in Israel and Palestine. The AGM of the Justice and Peace Co-ordinating Council will be held on Saturday 13 January 2024. We will be joined by Sir John Battle who was a Labour party Member of Parliament for 1987 to 2010. A committed Catholic, John frequently speaks on issues around Catholic Social Teaching and is chair of the Justice and Peace Commission for Leeds Diocese. He will be speaking to us about integrity in public life. We will be having the meeting in Newcastle (venue to be confirmed) and the day will last from 10.30am to 3.30pm.
