#### **Remembrance Sunday**

On Remembrance Sunday, we honour the service and sacrifice of the Armed Forces, the emergency services and especially those who lost their lives to defend our freedoms and way of life. Jesus says in the gospel - "Greater love has no-one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 15:13) - it is fitting, therefore, that we take time to commemorate those who made the ultimate sacrifice and to pray for their families.

People often ask what lessons have been learned from the two world wars. The establishment of the United Nations in 1945 and the agreement of the UN Charter was certainly a global attempt to prevent another war like the one they had just lived through. But despite efforts to maintain peace, protect human rights and uphold international law over many years, it is clear that war still exists to this day - and foremost in our minds right now are the conflicts in Ukraine and the Middle East.

The church's teaching on war begins and ends with its teaching on peace. The Catechism says: "Peace is not merely the absence of war, and it is not limited to maintain a balance of power between adversaries. Peace cannot be attained on earth ... without respect for the dignity of persons and peoples ... Peace is the work of justice and the effect of charity." (No.2304)



Pope John Paul II warned that peace is destroyed "wherever the strong exploit the weak; wherever the rich take advantage of the poor; wherever great powers seek to dominate and to impose ideologies." Pope Paul VI put it neatly, "If you want peace, work for justice."

So, as we give thanks today for those who gave their lives in the two world wars, let us also pray for those caught up in current conflicts, echoing the words of Pope Francis in his first Easter Sunday message in 2013:

"We ask the Risen Jesus, who turns death into life,

to change hatred into love,

vengeance into forgiveness,

war into peace.

Yes, Christ is our peace,

and through him we implore peace for all the world."

### First Reading: The Search for Wisdom: Wisdom 6:12-16

Wisdom is bright, and does not grow dim. By those who love her she is readily seen, and found by those who look for her. Quick to anticipate those who desire her, she makes herself known to them. Watch for her early and you will have no trouble; you will find her sitting at your gates. Even to think about her is understanding fully grown; be on the alert for her and anxiety will quickly leave you. She herself walks about looking for those who are worthy of her and graciously shows herself to them as they go, in every thought of theirs coming to meet them.

# The Response to the Psalm: For you my soul is thirsting, O God, my God.

#### Second Reading: The Last Trumpet: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

We want you to be quite certain, brothers, about those who have died, to make sure that you do not grieve about them, like the other people who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them with him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the archangel will call out the command and the Lord himself will come down from heaven; those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise, and then those of us who are still alive will be taken up in the clouds, together with them,

to meet the Lord in the air. So we shall stay with the Lord forever. With such thoughts as these you should comfort one another.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Stay awake and stand ready, because you do not know the hour when the Son of Man is coming. Alleluia!

### The Gospel: The Ten Wedding-Attendants: Matthew 25:1-13

Jesus told this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven will be like this: Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were sensible: the foolish ones did take their lamps, but they brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps. The bridegroom was late, and they all grew drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him." At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps, and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are going out." But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said, "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.'

#### The Ten Wedding-Attendants

Of course, they weren't bridesmaids! According to the custom of the time the girls were attendant on the bridegroom, to greet him with their lamps as he arrived at the wedding-reception. Anyway, half of them weren't ready, let him down, and then found themselves shut out. There is a subtle difference between the parables given in Mark's and Matthew's gospels. In Mark they are all about the sudden coming of God's Kingship in history, at the time of Jesus. Jesus proclaimed that the crisis was now. In him God's reign had arrived: it was time to take drastic action. Matthew's parables take a longer-term view: there will be a final judgment at the end of time, for which we, in the Church and in the course of history, must prepare. Some will and some won't. Some will be found to be wheat, others to be weeds. When the catch of fish comes in, some fish will be thrown away, some kept. Some will be sheep and others goats. Each year, as the liturgical year draws to a close, the Church reminds us of this. And the End will be sudden and unpredictable, like a burglar on the one night I forgot to lock the door, or like a mouse-trap snapping shut, or like the unpredictable moment of birth pangs. Am I ready for the coming of Christ? What does it mean to be like the wise bridesmaids and have oil in my lamp?

The Refugee Project continues to welcome clients from across the world. In September, we supported 531 individuals and families and received 29 new registrations from clients in need of food and toiletries to supplement their meagre allowance. With constantly growing numbers, we really do need and appreciate your donations of food, toiletries and finance. The full list of items required is available here. With the government's announcement that they are committed to clearing the backlog of cases that have been in the asylum system for some time, we are expecting the Home Office to make decisions about some of our clients in the coming months. We are always very pleased when clients receive news that they have been granted leave to remain, but recently the government has made changes, which are adversely affecting these clients by changing the time people are given to move out of asylum accommodation once they are given refugee status - the 28-day so-called 'move on' period - with some refugees having just seven days' notice. This is leaving some of our clients homeless. The Refugee Project has added its name to a letter from several charities to the Home Secretary asking the Home Office to amend this policy and prevent eviction notices and homelessness.

Update from Justice & Peace Refugee Project - This month's update from the J&P Co-ordinating Council includes details of the next Annual General Meeting. We join with other organisations to pray for peace across the world. We pray for wherever there is conflict and look with horror on the developing crisis in Israel and Palestine. The AGM of the Justice and Peace Co-ordinating Council will be held on Saturday 13 January 2024. We will be joined by Sir John Battle who was a Labour party Member of Parliament for 1987 to 2010. A committed Catholic, John frequently speaks on issues around Catholic Social Teaching and is chair of the Justice and Peace Commission for Leeds Diocese. He will be speaking to us about integrity in public life. We will be having the meeting in Newcastle (venue to be confirmed) and the day will last from 10.30am to 3.30pm.
